

TOMORROW IS MEMORIAL DAY

Memorial day is celebrated as a National Holiday the last Monday of May. It is sometimes called Decoration Day or Poppy Day. It is set aside to honor all Americans who gave their lives for our country.

The Holiday was first celebrated by the people of Waterloo, New York on May 5, 1866 and then again on May 5, 1867.

The Remembrance was first suggested by a pharmacist named Henry C. Welles in 1865.
General John A. Logan, Commander in Chief of the Grand Army of The Republic, proclaimed May 30th as Decoration Day by a General Order on

Since the end of World War I Memorial Day has also been known as Poppy Day. This was the idea of Moina Michael inspired by John McCrae's poem "In Flanders Fields".

In 1971 The Federal Government designated the last Monday in May as Memorial Day.
